

Substance Use Disorder (Addiction)

- Addiction is a preventable, treatable, chronic medical disease involving complex interactions among brain circuits, genetics, the environment, and an individual's life experiences.
- Prevention and treatment approaches for addiction are generally as successful as those for other chronic diseases.
- For those in stable recovery, the risk of a future recurrence in any year drops below 15%, which is about the same annual risk for a substance use disorder in the general population.

Levels of Care

ASAM Continuum of Care (Adult)*

- Level 1 Outpatient (1) Less than 9 hours/week for adults;
- Level 2 Intensive Outpatient (2.1, > 9 less than 20 hours/wk adults) and Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP 2.5, > 20 hours/wk adults)
- Level 3 Residential (3.1, 3.3, 3.5. 3.7) and Inpatient (3.7)
- Level 4 Intensive Inpatient (4)

*Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) can be offered across levels of care

Our Vision: Our end destination


Our vision is for no one to suffer or die from substance use disorder, a disease that is both preventable and treatable



Finding Addiction Treatment

- 1. Misinformation
- 2. Limited objective or unbiased information
- 3. Unclear what to look for
- 4. Predatory marketing practices
- 5. Hijacking ad words
- 6. Patient Brokering





A One-of-a-Kind Resource

- Consumer-friendly needs assessment
- Transparent indicators of treatment quality
- Not funded by providers or "pay to play"
- Comprehensive list of facilities
- Educational content
- Professional Portal
- Free and not for profit



Using Shatterproof Treatment Atlas

- Assessment find the best level of care for the member's symptoms and situation (ASAM collaboration), whether initial care or step-down level of care
- Providing science-based recommendations to individuals and families on:
 - the most appropriate level of care option (e.g., outpatient instead of residential)
 - specific services to seek (e.g., MAT, mental health care, withdrawal management)
 - science-based treatment providers



Using Shatterproof Treatment Atlas (con't)

- Find care that is in-network and high-quality
- Avoid out-of-network care, unnecessary cost and unknown quality data
- Patient Experience Survey (PES) allows members or family member to leave reviews and help guide others to treatment (over 70% of people count on review to make health care decisions)
- Important to find that best match between symptomatology, circumstances, resources, strengths (e.g., concerns about work or childcare)




National Expansion

6 States (2020) = 13% of US Population

10 states (2022) = 28% of US Population

14 States (2023) = 45% of US Population

ASAM Dimensions for Determining Level of Care

- Dimension 1 Acute Intoxication and/or Withdrawal Potential
- Dimension 2 Biomedical Conditions and Complications
- Dimension 3 Emotional, Behavioral or Cognitive Conditions and Complications
- Dimension 4 Readiness to Change
- Dimension 5 Relapse, Continued Use or Continued Problem Potential
- Dimension 6 Recovering/Living Environment
